## 2010 PRESIDENTIAL GUEST SPEAKER

*Presidential Guest Speaker*  
**RONALD S. DUBIN, M.D.**



A native of Detroit, Michigan, Dr. Dubin completed his undergraduate degree from the University of Michigan and medical school from Wayne State University. He has been in practice in Middlesboro, KY since his completion of his residency from the University of Missouri in 1986.

His hobbies and interests include long distance running completing 33 marathons, flying his Mooney 201 airplane, and is host of "Healthtalk" a weekly talk show aired in several states. He is currently running for mayor for the city of Harrogate, TN. He is married to Jo Ann Dubin of 23 years and has four children.

He is the founder and President of the Kentucky Orthopedic Clinic, as well as Open MRI of Kentucky and the MRI Research institute in Middlesboro and Corbin, KY. In addition he owns and operates two physical therapy clinics at these locations as a Stark In-Office Ancillary Exclusion.

In 2003, Dubin was sued in Franklin county Circuit Court in Frankfort, KY by the Kentucky State Board of Physical Therapy for billing for physical therapy services and utilizing certain CPT codes that used the words "physical therapy". In addition, the suit alleged that Dubin used the words "physical therapy" in a sign hanging on his office wall.

The lawsuit was won at the Circuit court, but was overturned several years later by the Kentucky Court of Appeals. In April, 2009, The Kentucky Supreme Court overturned the Court of Appeals ruling in a unanimous decision. In their ruling they emphasized the importance of fair trade and not to allow misinterpretation of the Kentucky Regulatory Statutes to protect physical therapists against competition from other health care providers.

Americus Briefs were filed by the Kentucky Medical Association and the American Medical Association as well as the Kentucky Physical Therapy Association and the American Physical Therapy Association.

## KEYNOTE SPEAKER

**WILLIAM ROBERT MARTIN, III, M.D.**

Dr. Martin is a board certified, fellowship trained, orthopedic surgeon and is the medical director for the American Academy of Orthopaedic Surgeons (AAOS). Dr. Martin is based out of the AAOS Office of Government Relations in Washington, D.C. He supervises the office of government relations, the medical affairs department, and the department of research and scientific affairs. Dr. Martin brings a unique perspective to the position of Medical Director having served in several practice settings. In addition, he has a history of advocacy and involvement, not only with the AAOS but also on the state level as the former Chair of the Arizona Medical Board (AMB) and on the national level as a member of the board of directors for the National Board of Medical Examiners (NBME).

A graduate of Tufts University, Dr. Martin received his Doctorate of Medicine from Loyola University's Stritch School of Medicine. He went on to a general surgery internship and an orthopaedic residency at Maricopa Medical Center in Phoenix, Arizona. He completed his training with a fellowship in adult foot and ankle reconstruction with Roger Mann, M.D., Oakland, California. Dr. Martin has continued postgraduate work in public health at the University of North Carolina, Chapel Hill.

Dr. Martin has been active professionally as a member of the Western Orthopaedic Association (WOA), the J. Robert Gladden Orthopaedic Society, the American Orthopaedic Foot and Ankle Society (AOFAS), the Federation of State Medical Boards (FSMB), the Arizona Orthopaedic Association, and the Arizona and American Medical Associations (AMA). Most recently, Dr. Martin has served the AAOS as a member of the Council on Advocacy and the Diversity Advisory Board. He was a member of the AAOS' Leadership Fellows Class of 2004, and has served on the Healthcare Delivery Committee, the Existing Government Program Workgroup, and the Board Advocacy Workshop Project Team.

He is the recipient of numerous awards for his research, humanitarian, and leadership efforts. He is an advocate for better healthcare for all and has special interests in children, the medically indigent, and, Native American populations.
